All pieces of art are to be framed ready to hang, total perimeter to be more than 44" but less than 90", unless specified. All the classes below are open to any age group unless specified. Only one entry per exhibitor in each class is permitted. NO NAMES ARE TO SHOW ON THE WORK. "NO PRIZE AWARDED UNLESS DEEMED WORTHY BY THE JUDGE."

There should be no marks or printing on the cardboard. New photos only (not shown before). No date stamps showing on the photos.
